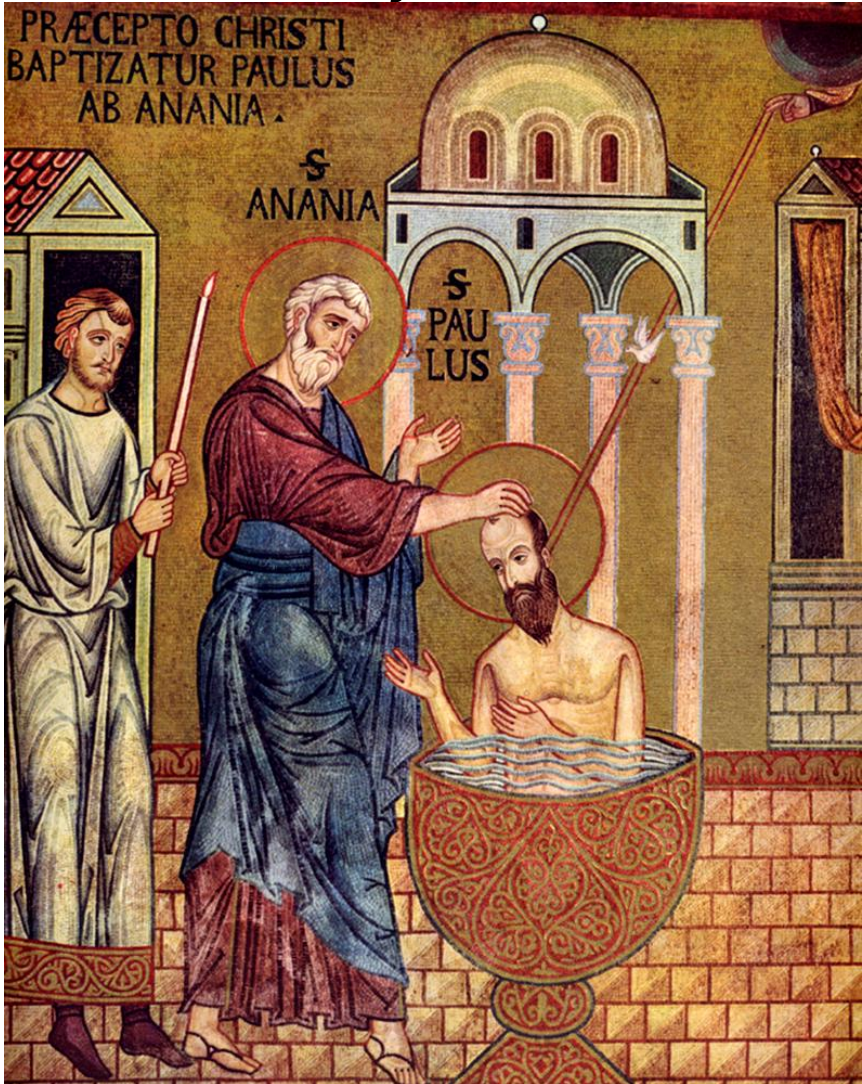

THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD THE READINGS

First Reading – Jeremiah 20:7-13

Reader: A Reading from Jeremiah

⁷ Lord, You persuaded me and I let myself be persuaded;
You have overcome me and prevailed.

I have become a laughingstock all day long;
Everyone mocks me.

⁸ For each time I speak, I cry aloud;
I proclaim violence and destruction,
Because for me the word of the Lord has resulted
In taunting and derision all day long.

⁹ But if I say, "I will not remember Him
Nor speak anymore in His name,"
Then in my heart it becomes like a burning fire
Shut up in my bones;
And I am tired of holding it in,
And I cannot endure it.

¹⁰ For I have heard the whispering of many,
"Terror on every side!"

Denounce him; let's denounce him!"

All my trusted friends,

Watching for my fall, say:

"Perhaps he will be persuaded, so that we may prevail
against him

And take our revenge on him."

¹¹ But the Lord is with me like a powerful champion;

Therefore my persecutors will stumble and not prevail.

¹² Yet, Lord of armies, who tests the righteous,

Psalms 69:8-20

8 Surely, for your sake have I suffered reproach, *

and shame has covered my face.

9 I have become a stranger to my own kindred, *

an alien to my mother's children.

10 Zeal for your house has eaten me up; *

the scorn of those who scorn you has fallen upon me.

11 I humbled myself with fasting, *

but that was turned to my reproach.

12 I put on sack-cloth also, *

and became a byword among them.

13 Those who sit at the gate murmur against me, *

and the drunkards make songs about me.

in your great compassion, turn to me."

19 "Hide not your face from your servant; *

be swift and answer me, for I am in distress.

20 Draw near to me and redeem me; *

because of my enemies deliver me

Second Reading – Romans 6:1-11

Reader: A reading from Romans

6 What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin so that grace may increase? ² Far from it! How shall we who died to sin still live in it? ³ Or do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus have been baptized into His death? ⁴ Therefore we have been buried with Him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too may walk in newness of life. ⁵ For if we have become united with *Him* in the likeness of His death, certainly we shall also be *in the likeness* of His resurrection, ⁶ knowing this, that our old self was crucified with *Him*, in order that our body of sin might be done away with, so that we would no longer be slaves to sin; ⁷ for the one who has died is freed from sin.

⁸ Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with Him, ⁹ knowing that Christ, having been raised from the dead, is never to die again; death no longer is master over Him. ¹⁰ For the death that He died, He died to sin once for all *time*; but the life that He lives, He lives to God. ¹¹ So you too, consider yourselves to be dead to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Reader: The Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

The Gospel – Matthew 10:24-39

Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia

Reader: The Lord be with you.

Reader: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ
according to St. Matthew

People: **Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

²⁴ “A disciple is not above his teacher, nor a slave above his master. ²⁵ It is enough for the disciple that he may become like his teacher, and the slave like his master. If they have called the head of the house Beelzebul, how much more *will they insult* the members of his household!

²⁶ “So do not fear them, for there is nothing concealed that will not be revealed, or hidden that will not be known. ²⁷ What I tell you in the darkness, tell in the light; and what you hear *whispered* in *your* ear, proclaim on the housetops. ²⁸ And do not be afraid of those who kill the body but are unable to kill the soul; but rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell. ²⁹ Are two sparrows not sold for an assarion? And yet not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father. ³⁰ But even the hairs of your head are all counted. ³¹ So do not fear; you are more valuable than a great number of sparrows.

³² “Therefore, everyone who confesses Me before people, I will also confess him before My Father who is in heaven. ³³ But whoever denies Me before people, I will also deny him before My Father who is in heaven.

³⁴ “Do not think that I came to bring peace on the earth; I did not come to bring peace, but a sword. ³⁵ For I came to TURN A MAN AGAINST HIS FATHER, AND A DAUGHTER AGAINST HER MOTHER, AND A DAUGHTER-IN-LAW AGAINST HER MOTHER-IN-LAW; ³⁶ and A PERSON’S ENEMIES *WILL BE* THE MEMBERS OF HIS HOUSEHOLD.

³⁷ “The one who loves father or mother more than Me is not worthy of Me; and the one who loves son or daughter more than Me is not worthy of Me. ³⁸ And the one who does not take his cross and follow after Me is not worthy of Me. ³⁹ The

one who has found his life will lose it, and the one who has lost his life on My account will find it.

Reader: The Gospel of Christ.

People: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia
