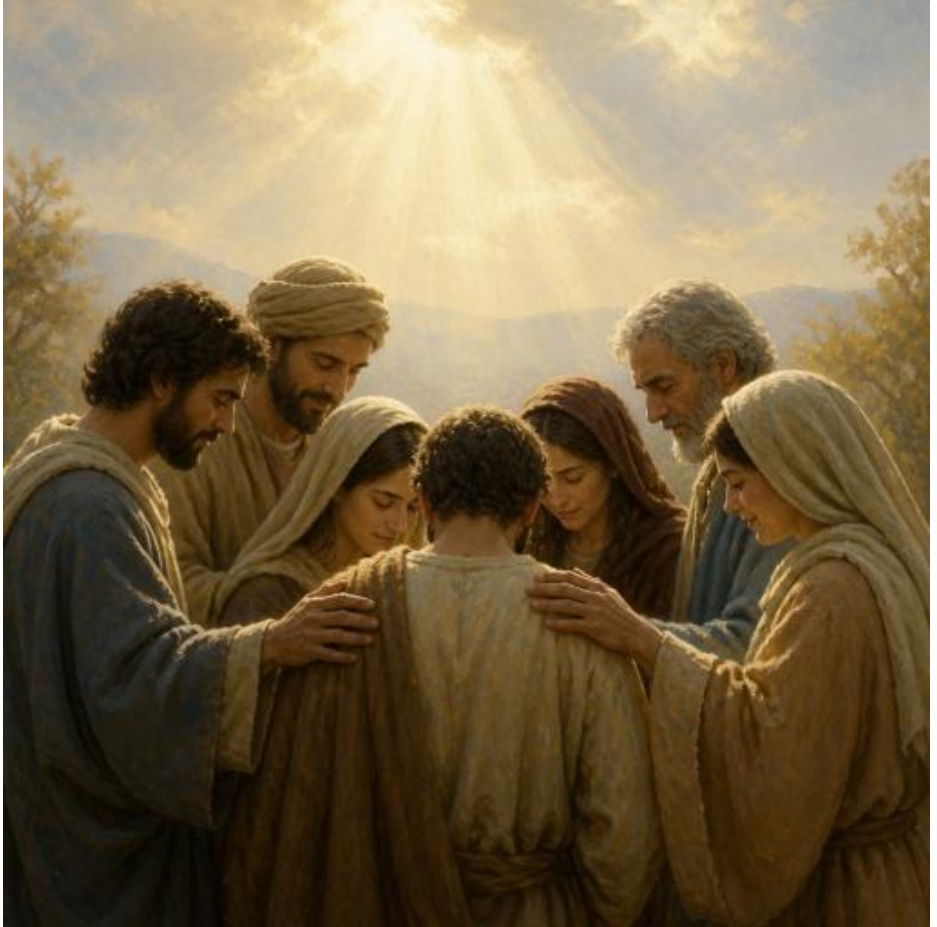

THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

THE READINGS

First Reading – Jeremiah 28:5-9

Reader: A Reading from Jeremiah

⁵ Then Jeremiah the prophet spoke to the prophet Hananiah in the sight of the priests and in the sight of all the people who were standing at the house of the LORD, ⁶ and Jeremiah the prophet said, "Amen! May the LORD do so; may the LORD fulfill your words which you have prophesied, to bring back the vessels of the LORD'S house and all the exiles, from Babylon to this place. ⁷ Yet hear now this word which I am going to speak so that you and all the people can hear it! ⁸ The prophets who were before me and before you from ancient times also prophesied against many lands and against great kingdoms regarding war, disaster, and plague. ⁹ As *for* the prophet who prophesies of peace, when the word of the prophet comes to pass, then that prophet will be known as one whom the LORD has truly sent."

Reader: The Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

Psalms 89:1-4, 15-18

¹ I will sing of the graciousness of the LORD forever;

To all generations I will make Your faithfulness known with my mouth.

² For I have said, "Graciousness will be built up forever;

In the heavens You will establish Your faithfulness."

³ "I have made a covenant with My chosen;

I have sworn to My servant David,

⁴ I will establish your descendants forever

And build up your throne to all generations."

¹⁵ Blessed are the people who know the joyful sound!

Lord, they walk in the light of Your face.

¹⁶ In Your name they rejoice all the day,

And by Your righteousness they are exalted.

¹⁷ For You are the glory of their strength,

And by Your favor our horn is exalted.

¹⁸ For our shield belongs to the Lord,

And our king to the Holy One of Israel.

Second Reading – Romans 6:12-23

Reader: A reading from Romans

¹² Therefore sin is not to reign in your mortal body so that you obey its lusts, ¹³ and do not go on presenting the parts of your body to sin as instruments of unrighteousness; but present yourselves to God as those who are alive from the dead, and your body's parts as instruments of righteousness for God. ¹⁴ For sin shall not be master over you, for you are not under the Law but under grace.

¹⁵ What then? Are we to sin because we are not under the Law but under grace? Far from it! ¹⁶ Do you not know that *the one* to whom you present yourselves as slaves for obedience, you are slaves of *that same one* whom you obey, either of sin resulting in death, or of obedience resulting in righteousness? ¹⁷ But thanks be to

God that though you were slaves of sin, you became obedient from the heart to *that* form of teaching to which you were entrusted,¹⁸ and after being freed from sin, you became slaves to righteousness.¹⁹ I am speaking in human terms because of the weakness of your flesh. For just as you presented the parts of your body as slaves to impurity and to lawlessness, resulting in *further* lawlessness, so now present your body's parts as slaves to righteousness, resulting in sanctification.²⁰ For when you were slaves of sin, you were free in relation to righteousness.²¹ Therefore what benefit were you then deriving from the things of which you are now ashamed? For the outcome of those things is death.²² But now having been freed from sin and enslaved to God, you derive your benefit, resulting in sanctification, and the outcome, eternal life.²³ For the wages of sin is death, but the gracious gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Reader: The Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

⁴⁰ "The one who receives you receives Me, and the one who receives Me receives Him who sent Me.⁴¹ The one who receives a prophet in *the* name of a prophet shall receive a prophet's reward; and the one who receives a righteous person in the name of a righteous person shall receive a righteous person's reward.⁴² And whoever gives

one of these little ones just a cup of cold *water* to drink in the name of a disciple, truly I say to you, he shall by no means lose his reward."

Reader: The Gospel of Christ.

People: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ. Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia

and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Rev. Oz: We give thanks to you, Lord our God,
for the goodness and love

to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary,
to be the Saviour and Redeemer of the world.

out of death into life.

On the night he was handed over

to suffering and death,
a death he freely accepted,
our Lord Jesus Christ took bread;

this is my body which is given for you.
Do this for the remembrance of me."
After supper he took the cup of wine;
and when he had given thanks,

this is my blood of the new covenant,
which is shed for you and for many
for the forgiveness of sins.
Whenever you drink it,
do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, Father, according to his command,

**All: we remember his death,
we proclaim his resurrection,
we await his coming in glory;**

Rev. Oz: and we offer our sacrifice
of praise and thanksgiving
to you, Lord of all;
presenting to you, from your creation,
this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God,
to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts,
that they may be the sacrament
of the body of Christ
and his blood of the new covenant.
Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice,
that we, made acceptable in him,
may be sanctified by the Holy Spirit.
In the fullness of time,

reconcile all things in Christ,
and make them new,
and bring us to that city of light
where you dwell with all your sons and
daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord,
the firstborn of all creation,
the head of the Church,
and the author of our salvation;
by whom, and with whom, and in whom,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
all honour and glory are yours,
almighty Father, now and forever.
