

THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

THE READINGS

First Reading – Ecclesiastes 1:2, 12-14; 2:18-23

Reader: A reading from Ecclesiastes ² "Futility of futilities," says the Preacher,

"Futility of futilities! All is futility." ...

¹² I, the Preacher, have been king over Israel in Jerusalem. ¹³ And I set my mind to seek and explore by wisdom about everything that has been done under heaven. *It* is a sorry task with which God has given the sons of mankind to be troubled. ¹⁴ I have seen all the works which have been done under the sun, and behold, all is futility and striving after wind...

2¹⁸ So I hated all the fruit of my labor for which I had labored under the sun, because I must leave it to the man who will come after me. ¹⁹ And who knows whether he will be wise or a fool? Yet he will have control over all the fruit of my labor for which I have labored by acting wisely under the sun. This too is futility. ²⁰ Therefore I completely despaired over all the fruit of my labor for which I had labored under the sun. ²¹ When there is a person who has labored with wisdom, knowledge, and skill, and then gives his legacy to one who has not labored for it; this too is futility and a great

evil. ²² For what does a person get in all his labor and in his striving with which he labors under the sun? ²³ Because all his days his activity is painful and irritating; even at night his mind does not rest. This too is futility.

Reader: The Word of the Lord. People: Thanks be to God.

Psalm 49:1-11

¹ Hear this, all you peoples; hearken, all you who dwell in the world,

you of high degree and low, rich and poor together.

² My mouth shall speak of wisdom,

and my heart shall meditate on understanding.

³ I will incline my ear to a proverb

and set forth my riddle upon the harp.

- Why should I be afraid in evil days, when the wickedness of those at my heels surrounds me.
- ⁵ The wickedness of those who put their trust in their goods, and boast of their great riches?
- ⁶ We can never ransom ourselves,

or deliver to God the price of our life;

⁷ For the ransom of our life is so great,

that we should never have enough to pay it,

⁸ In order to live for ever and ever,

and never see the grave.

⁹ For we see that the wise die also; like the dull and stupid they perish

and leave their wealth to those who come after them.

¹⁰ Their graves shall be their homes for ever, their dwelling places from generation to generation,

though they call the lands after their own names.

¹¹ Even though honoured, they cannot live for ever; they are like the beasts that perish.

Second Reading - Colossians 3:1-11

Reader: A reading from Colossians

³ Therefore, if you have been raised with Christ, keep seeking the things *that are* above, where Christ is, seated at

the right hand of God. ² Set your minds on the things *that* are above, not on the things that are on earth. ³ For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴ When Christ, who is our life, is revealed, then you also will be revealed with Him in glory.

⁵ Therefore, treat the parts of your earthly body as dead *to* sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed, which amounts to idolatry. ⁶ For it is because of these things *that* the wrath of God is coming upon the sons of disobedience, ⁷ and in them you also once walked, when you were living in them. ⁸ But now you also, rid yourselves of all of them: anger, wrath, malice, slander, *and* obscene speech from your mouth. ⁹ Do not lie to one another, since you stripped off the old self with its *evil* practices, ¹⁰ and have put on the new *self*, which is being renewed to a true knowledge according to the image of the One who created it— ¹¹ a renewal in which there is no distinction between Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, *and* free, but Christ is all, and in all.

Reader: The Word of the Lord. People: Thanks be to God.

The Gospel – Luke 12:13-21

Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia

Reader: The Lord be with you. People: And also with you.

Reader: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ

according to Luke

People: Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

¹³ Now someone in the crowd said to Him, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the *family* inheritance with me." ¹⁴ But He said to him, "You there—who appointed Me a judge or arbitrator over *the two of* you?" ¹⁵ But He said to them, "Beware, and be on your guard against every form of greed; for not *even* when one is affluent does his life consist of his possessions." ¹⁶ And He told them a parable, saying, "The land of a rich man was very productive. ¹⁷ And

he began thinking to himself, saying, 'What shall I do, since I have no place to store my crops?' ¹⁸ And he said, 'This *is what* I will do: I will tear down my barns and build larger ones, and I will store all my grain and my goods there. ¹⁹ And I will say to myself, "You have many goods stored up for many years *to come*; relax, eat, drink, *and* enjoy yourself!"' ²⁰ But God said to him, 'You fool! This *very* night your soul is demanded of you; and *as for all* that you have prepared, who will own *it now*?' ²¹ Such is the one who stores up treasure for himself, and is not rich in relation to God."

Reader: The Gospel of Christ.

THE NICENE CREED

and with all the holy people who have served you in every age, we raise our voices to proclaim the glory of your name.

People: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Rev. Oz: We give thanks to you, Lord our God, for the goodness and love you have made known to us in creation; in calling Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus your Son.

For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Saviour and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness,

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, a death he freely accepted, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, Father, according to his command, All: we remember his death, we proclaim his resurrection, we await his coming in glory;

Rev. Oz: and we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts, that they may be the sacrament of the body of Christ and his blood of the new covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we, made acceptable in him, may be sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, reconcile all things in Christ, and make them new, and bring us to that city of light where you dwell with all your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation. the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation:

by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father, now and forever.
