

First Reading - 1 Kings 19:15-16,19-21

Reader: The Lesson is written in the 19th Chapter of 1 Kings beginning at the 15th verse.

- ¹⁵ The Lord said to him, "Go, return on your way to the wilderness of Damascus; and when you have arrived, you shall anoint Hazael king over Aram. ¹⁶ You shall also anoint Jehu the son of Nimshi king over Israel; and you shall anoint Elisha the son of Shaphat of Abel-meholah as prophet in your place.
- ¹⁹ So he departed from there and found Elisha the son of Shaphat while he was plowing, with twelve yoke *of oxen* in

front of him, and he with the twelfth. And Elijah came over to him and threw his cloak on him. ²⁰ Then he left the oxen behind and ran after Elijah, and said, "Please let me kiss my father and my mother, then I will follow you." And he said to him, "Go back, for what have I done to you?" ²¹ So he returned from following him, and took the pair of oxen and sacrificed them, and cooked their meat with the implements of the oxen, and gave *it* to the people and they ate. Then he got up and followed Elijah and served him.

¹ PRESERVE me, O God,

Second Reading – Galatians 5:1-2,6,13-25

Reader: The Epistle is written in the 5th Chapter of Galatians beginning at the 1st verse.

¹ It was for freedom that Christ set us free; therefore keep standing firm and do not be subject again to a yoke of slavery. ² Look! I, Paul, tell you that if you have yourselves circumcised, Christ will be of no benefit to you. ⁶ For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision means anything, but faith working through love. ¹³ For you were called to freedom, brothers *and sisters*; only *do* not *turn* your freedom into an opportunity for the flesh, but serve one another through love. ¹⁴ For the whole Law is fulfilled in one word, in the *statement*, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." ¹⁵ But if you bite and devour one another, take care that you are not consumed by

¹⁶ But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not carry out the desire of the flesh. ¹⁷ For the desire of the flesh is against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh; for these are in opposition to one another, in order to keep you from doing whatever you want. ¹⁸ But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the Law. 19 Now the deeds of the flesh are evident, which are: sexual immorality, impurity, indecent behavior, ²⁰ idolatry, witchcraft, hostilities, strife, jealousy, outbursts of anger, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions, ²¹ envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these, of which I forewarn you, just as I have forewarned you, that those who practice such things will not inherit the kingdom of God. ²² But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, ²³ gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. 24 Now those who belong to Christ Jesus crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. ²⁵ If we live by the Spirit, let's follow the Spirit as well. The Gospel – Luke 9:51-62

Reader: The Holy Gospel is written in the 9th Chapter of the Gospel according to Saint Luke beginning at the 51st verse.

People: Glory be to thee, O Lord.

⁵¹ When the days were approaching for His ascension, He was determined to go to Jerusalem; ⁵² and He sent messengers on ahead of Him, and they went and entered a village of the Samaritans to make arrangements for Him. ⁵³ And they did not receive Him, because He was traveling toward Jerusalem. ⁵⁴ When His disciples James and John saw *this*, they said, "Lord, do You want us to command fire to come down from heaven and consume them?" ⁵⁵ But He turned and rebuked them. ⁵⁶ And they went on to another village.

⁵⁷ As they were going on the road, someone said to Him, "I will follow You wherever You go." ⁵⁸ And Jesus said to

him, "The foxes have holes and the birds of the sky *have* nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay His head." ⁵⁹ And He said to another, "Follow Me." But he said, "Lord, permit me first to go and bury my father." ⁶⁰ But He said to him, "Allow the dead to bury their own dead; but as for you, go and proclaim everywhere the kingdom of God." ⁶¹ Another also said, "I will follow You, Lord; but first permit me to say goodbye to those at my home." ⁶² But Jesus said to him, "No one, after putting his hand to the plow and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God."
