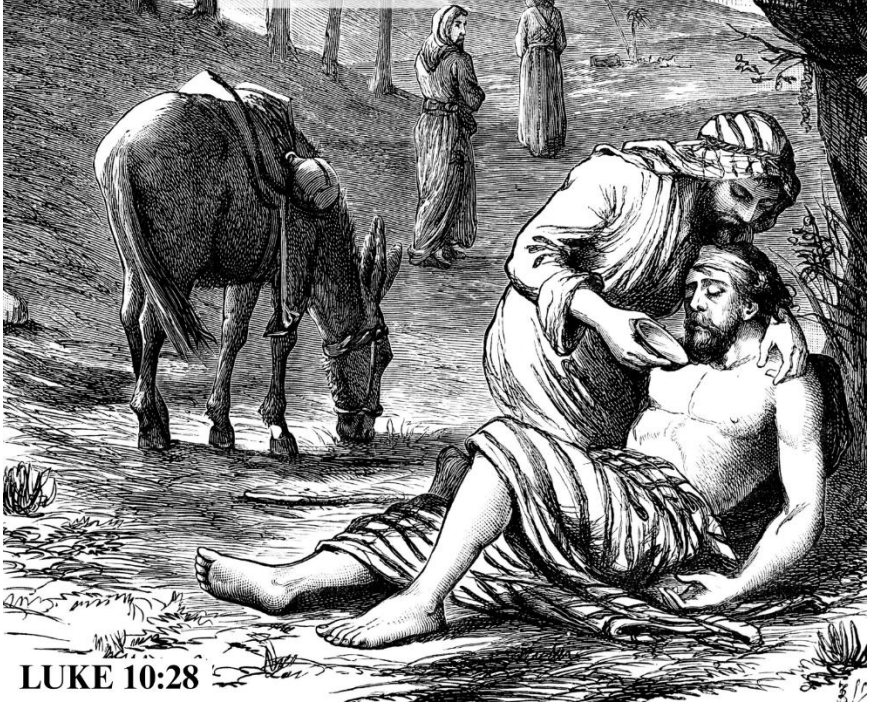

<sup>1</sup> THE LORD is my light and my salvation; whom then shall I fear? /

the LORD is the strength of my life; of whom then shall I be afraid?

<sup>2</sup> When the wicked came upon me to eat up my flesh, / even mine enemies and my foes, they stumbled and fell.

<sup>3</sup> Though an host of men were laid against me, yet shall not my heart be afraid; /

and though there rose up war against me, yet will I put my trust in him.

<sup>4</sup> ONE thing have I desired of the LORD, which I will require/ even that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to behold the fair beauty of the LORD, and to visit his temple.

<sup>5</sup> For in the time of trouble he shall hide me in his tabernacle/ yea, in the secret place of his dwelling shall he hide me, and set me up upon a rock of stone.

<sup>6</sup> And now shall my head be lifted up / above mine enemies round about me.

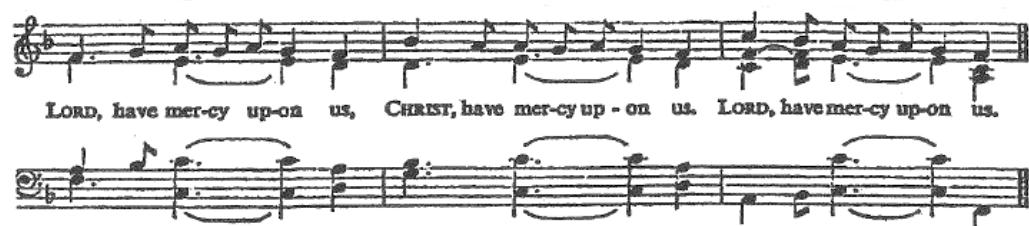
<sup>7</sup> Therefore will I offer in his dwelling an oblation with great gladness: /

### First Reading – Deuteronomy 30:9-14

**Reader:** The Lesson is written in the 30th Chapter of Deuteronomy beginning at the 9th verse.

<sup>9</sup> Then the Lord your God will prosper you abundantly in every work of your hand, in the children of your womb, the offspring of your cattle, and in the produce of your ground, for the Lord will again rejoice over you for good, just as He rejoiced over your fathers; <sup>10</sup> if you obey the Lord your God, to keep His commandments and His statutes which are written in this Book of the Law, if you turn to the Lord your God with all your heart and soul.

<sup>11</sup> "For this commandment which I am commanding you today is not too difficult for you, nor is it far away. <sup>12</sup> It is not in heaven, that you could say, 'Who will go up to heaven for us and get it for us, and proclaim it to us, so that we may follow it?' <sup>13</sup> Nor is it beyond the sea, that you could say, 'Who will cross the sea for us and get it for us and proclaim it to us, so that we may follow it?' <sup>14</sup> On the contrary, the word is very near you, in your mouth and in your heart, that you may follow it.

<sup>1</sup> UNTO thee, O LORD, do I lift up my soul;

**my God, I have put my trust in thee.**

<sup>2</sup> O let me not be confounded,

**neither let mine enemies triumph over me.**

<sup>3</sup> For all they that hope in thee shall not be ashamed;  
**but such as transgress without a cause shall be put to confusion.**

<sup>4</sup> Show me thy ways, O LORD,  
**and teach me thy paths.**

<sup>5</sup> Lead me forth in thy truth and teach me:  
**for thou art the God of my salvation; in thee is my hope all the day long.**

<sup>6</sup> Call to remembrance, O LORD, thy tender mercies,  
**and thy loving-kindnesses, which have been ever of old.**

<sup>7</sup> O remember not the sins and offences of my youth;  
**but according to thy mercy think thou upon me, O LORD, for thy goodness.**

<sup>8</sup> GRACIOUS and righteous is the LORD;  
**therefore will he teach sinners in the way.**

<sup>9</sup> Them that are meek shall he guide in judgement;  
**and such as are gentle, them shall he teach his way.**

<sup>10</sup> All the paths of the LORD are mercy and truth,  
**unto such as keep his covenant and his testimonies.**

## **Second Reading – Colossians 1:1-14**

**Reader:** The Epistle is written in the 1st Chapter of Colossians beginning at the 1st verse.

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God,  
and Timothy our brother,

<sup>2</sup> To the saints and faithful brothers *and sisters* in Christ *who are* at Colossae: Grace to you and peace from God our Father.

<sup>3</sup> We give thanks to God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, praying always for you, <sup>4</sup> since we heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and the love which you have for all the saints; <sup>5</sup> because of the hope reserved for you in heaven, of which you previously heard in the word of truth, the gospel <sup>6</sup> which has come to you, just as in all the world also it is bearing fruit and increasing, even as *it has been doing* in you also since the day you heard *it* and understood the grace of God in truth; <sup>7</sup> just as you learned *it* from Epaphras,

our beloved fellow bond-servant, who is a faithful servant of Christ on our behalf, <sup>8</sup> and he also informed us of your love in the Spirit.

<sup>9</sup> For this reason we also, since the day we heard *about it*, have not ceased praying for you and asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of His will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, <sup>10</sup> so that you will walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, to please *Him* in all respects, bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God; <sup>11</sup> strengthened with all power, according to His glorious might, for the attaining of all perseverance and patience; joyously <sup>12</sup> giving thanks to the Father, who has qualified us to share in the inheritance of the saints in light.

<sup>13</sup> For He rescued us from the domain of darkness, and transferred us to the kingdom of His beloved Son, <sup>14</sup> in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

## **The Gospel – Luke 10:25-37**

**Reader:** The Holy Gospel is written in the 10th Chapter of the Gospel according to Saint Luke beginning at the 25th verse.

**People: Glory be to thee, O Lord.**

<sup>25</sup> And behold, a lawyer stood up and put Him to the test, saying, "Teacher, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?" <sup>26</sup> And He said to him, "What is written in the Law? How does it read to you?" <sup>27</sup> And he answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself." <sup>28</sup> And He said to him, "You have answered correctly; do this and you will live." <sup>29</sup> But wanting to justify himself, he said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?"

<sup>30</sup> Jesus replied and said, "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and he encountered robbers, and they stripped him and beat him, and went away leaving him half dead. <sup>31</sup> And by coincidence a priest was going down on that road, and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. <sup>32</sup> Likewise a Levite also, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. <sup>33</sup> But a Samaritan who was on a journey came upon him; and when he saw him, he felt compassion, <sup>34</sup> and came to him and bandaged up his wounds, pouring oil and wine on *them*; and he put him on his own animal, and brought him to an inn and took care of him. <sup>35</sup> On the next day he took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper and said, 'Take care of him; and whatever more you spend, when I return, I will repay you.' <sup>36</sup> Which of these three do you think proved to be a neighbor to the man who fell into the robbers' *hands*?" <sup>37</sup> And he said, "The one who showed compassion to him." Then Jesus said to him, "Go and do the same."
